


Bear habitat in Southeastern Vermont:

 Seasonal bear habitat


Sources:

- Historic sites and scenic areas were identified by the Marlboro Planning Commission in 1994, and updated in 2008. Locations were determined by WRC using 1:5000 base GIS data.
- Information on wildlife crossings is from work conducted by the Marlboro Conservation Commission in 2007. The crossings shown on this map are including Route 9 and South Road only.
- Public and conserved lands data were obtained from WRC mapping, the Town of Marlboro, the Vermont Land Trust, and the Vermont Conservation Lands Database developed by UVM Spatial Analysis Laboratory.
- Data on rare and threatened plant occurrences were taken from VT ANR Department of Fish and Wildlife, Nongame and Natural Heritage Program's Rare, Threatened and Endangered Species and Significant Natural Communities database (VGIS data layer ENDANGER). The database is current to February 1997. Locations are approximate, but generally within 200 meters.
- The wetlands shown are those included in the Vermont Significant Wetlands Inventory (VGIS data layer VSWI). For the most part, these data were derived from US Fish and Wildlife Service's 1:24000/1:25000 scale National Wetlands Inventory (NWI) maps. These maps show approximate locations of wetlands that are generally 3 acres or larger in size.
- Bear habitat data are from GIS data provided the University of Vermont's Spatial Analysis Laboratory. This data layer was developed from Vermont Agency of Natural Resources, Department of Fish and Wildlife habitat maps to provide a general overview of bear habitat.






Sources:

- Surface waters are from the Vermont Hydrography Dataset (VGIS data layer SWnnnnnnn). The dataset was generated at a scale of 1:5000 and was developed using digital orthophotos, topographic maps, color infrared aerial photography and other ancillary data sources.
- The designation of intermittent versus perennial streams was taken from USGS topographic maps.
- The wetlands shown are those included in the Vermont Significant Wetlands Inventory (VGIS data layer VSWI). For the most part, these data were derived from US Fish and Wildlife Service's 1:24000/1:25000 scale National Wetlands Inventory (NWI) maps. These maps show approximate locations of wetlands that are generally 3 acres or larger in size.
- The delineated portion of the Sunset Lake Watershed contributes to Brattleboro's public community water system. It is classified as a Surface Water Source Protection Area by the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources. Boundary data are from VT ANR Water Supply Division digital data.
- Flood hazard areas were approximated from FEMA maps. These boundaries should not be used as a replacement for the official maps.
- Shorelands are those areas within 300 feet of a major water body, as defined by the Town of Marlboro.


- Town highway locations are from Vt. Agency of Transportation sources (VGIS data layer RDSnnnn) and were developed by digitizing 1989 1:5000 orthophotos and from GPS data collection for Enhanced 9-1-1. Data were corrected by WRC GIS staff using digital orthophotos and information provided by Cartographic Technologies, Inc. and officials from the Town of Marlboro.

- Town highway attributes (i.e. class and pavement) are from AOT highway maps. These data were corrected by WRC GIS staff using information provided by officials from the Town of Marlboro.

- Road names data were provided by the Town of Marlboro.

- Community & educational facilities and recreation sites were identified by the Marlboro Planning Commission in 1994. Locations were determined by WRC using 1:5000 base GIS data.

- Structure locations were captured using Global Positioning System technology by microDATA, St. Johnsbury, VT for Vermont's Enhanced 9-1-1 program. Locations have been edited by Cartographic Technologies, Inc. and WRC in 2006 using digital orthophotos.

- Forested and open lands were digitized from 2000 1:5000 Vermont orthophotos and 2003 National Aerial Imagery Program orthophotos by WRC GIS staff.


- Parcel lines are from GIS data developed by Cartographic Technologies, Inc. (CTI), Brattleboro, Vt., and are current to 2006. These data are based upon a previous set of parcel maps created at a scale of 1:5000.

- Public and conserved lands data were obtained from WRC mapping, the Town of Marlboro, the Vermont Land Trust, and the Vermont Conservation Lands Database developed by UVM Spatial Analysis Laboratory.
