Discussion

- The Department of Housing and Community Development and the Congress for New Urbanism produced a new manual, "Enabling Better Places: A Zoning Guide for Vermont Neighborhood," after a year of work with six Vermont communities. The manual offers suggestions for incremental changes to increase housing access and affordability. We discussed adding an action step to the Marlboro Town Plan that recommends reviewing this guide and using it as a reference. We plan to add this action step at the next Planning Board meeting.
- The FFA has raised the height limit of towers (e.g. windmill and cell) from 149 feet to 200ft before it needs lights.
- There is a de facto Marlboro Cemetery Committee of Linda Peters and Forrest Holzapfel and Jesse Kreitzer.
- Discussion of the Planning Commission's role in maintaining trail systems in the town. We will explore this issue by reviewing other town language on trails (such as Shrewsbury) and consider whether to include an action step in the Marlboro Town Plan.
