  - o Will comment on the condition of the road that bears attention.
- See if Nat'l Grid can then repair the work road
- Make sure VLT connects with HPC re: contact information

## **SVNHM Report**

  - Grant from Thompson Trust
- Some new developments on the future of the Museum and new location
- Volunteers going to review the eagle's nests

#### **Old Business**

- Is there a purpose of 2 organizations?
  - o HPC town body to meet open meeting laws
    - Good to have body representing the town
  - o Decision to move to HMCA will operate as a non-profit
  - o Having one organization can streamline operations and recommendations
    - Town will need to approve this change
    - Need to articulate the outcome of a merger of the organizations

#### **New Business**

- Endowment decision to return to HMCA
  - o Trustees for public funds: Were given history of land from HMCA
    - Main aim for HMCA endowment fund is invested prudently and carefully.
    - HMCA reviewing the information to ensure funds and land protected properly.
    - Presently working on gathering this information
  - o HPC will inquire with town regarding the status of the endowment as soon as they receive some documentation from the HMCA
