



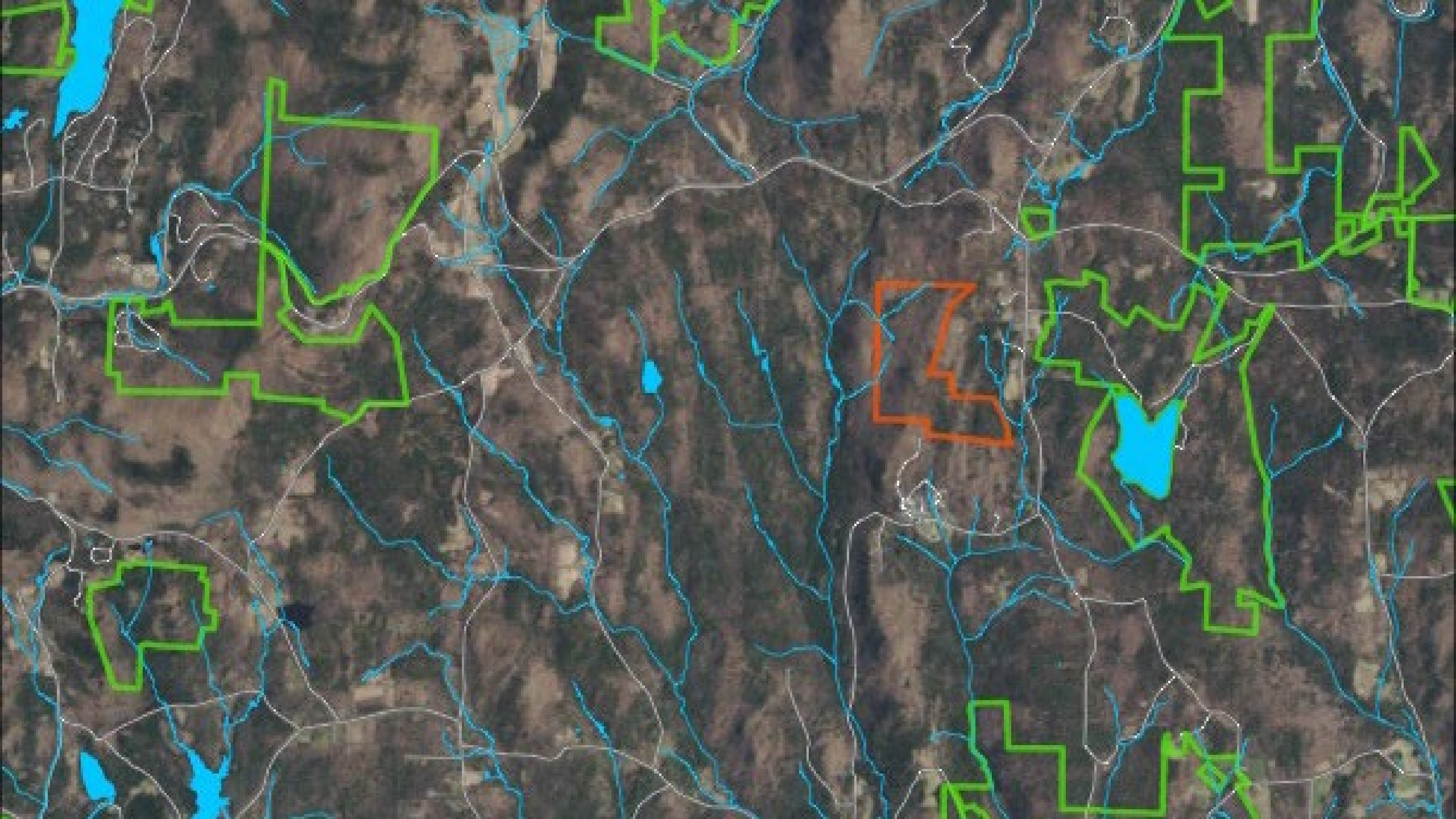
HENDRICKS LAND CONSERVATION PROJECT

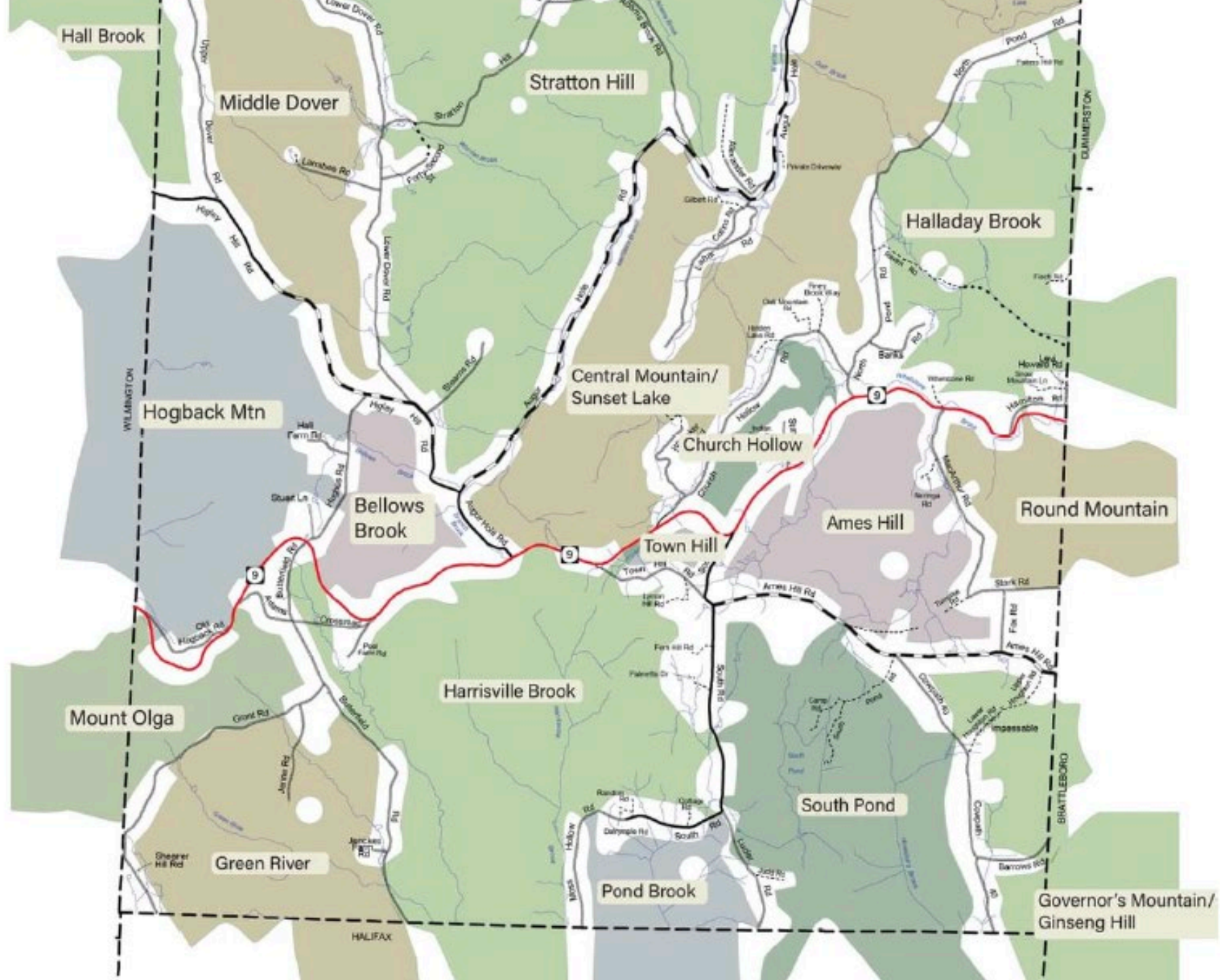
